Joe Reidhead, Cal Trans District 9:

For 120 West, Caltrans crews are currently near Blue Slide. Our PIO is headed up tomorrow morning and I might be able to get you some photos before your meeting. Happy to text them to you or email.

Caltrans also has two projects just north of Lee Vining that will begin soon:

- 1) Conway Ranch Shoulders goes from 167 to approximately 0.4 miles north of Conway Ranch Road. This project will widen shoulders, install rumble strips, improve the chain control area, and correct a curve.
- 2) Cemetery CAPM goes from 0.2 miles south of Cemetery Rd to State Route 167. This is a minor pavement rehabilitation project that will upgrade guardrail and replace traffic signs.

Granite Construction was awarded both contracts, and they plan to start with Conway Ranch and then do Cemetery CAPM. We do not have an exact start date yet, but once we know it will be posted to the Conway Ranch Shoulders project page: https://dot.ca.gov/caltrans-near-me/district-9/district-9-projects-list/conway-ranch-shoulder-widening-project

From Chris Moracek, Mono County Emergency Operations:

We continue to prepare for significant runoff in the next few weeks. Lee Vining Creek and Mill Creek should be impressive. Sand and sandbags are available at the Lee Vining Road Shop.

FEMA will be setting up Disaster Recovery Centers (DRC) in Bridgeport and Mammoth Lakes. They will also provide mobile DRC's to the individual communities on specific days. Schedule to be determined. They will assist individuals who experienced damage (structural and financial) during the Feb/Mar storms to register for Individual Assistance from FEMA. Centers tentatively set to open on May 15th.

From Jeff Simpson, Mono County Tourism and Economic Development:

- -Disaster Emergency Loans through the SBA are available for all businesses impacted by the winter storms. Apply at <u>SBA.gov</u>
- -Talked with CDFW. Fish are in all hatcheries and we will receive 75% of our normal allotment with them.
- -Mono County stocking schedule is set. We will have two loads of 500 pound mix fish to Lee vining creek and Lundy Lake. We will not do Saddlebag Lake due to snow and access issues.
- -We will have a business appreciation meeting for Lee Vining businesses on April 12th from 3-5 in the community center with catered food! I'll have a presentation on Tourism analytics along with a company speaking on how businesses can take advantage of Google tools and how to register their business on the platform. Please RSVP if you plan to participate in the lunch part of the meeting.
- -We have a USDA rep giving a virtual presentation on May 15th to discuss all their programs and available funding. Time and invite will come in a few weeks.

From Matt Paruolo, SCE Local Public Affairs:

SCE has received a few inquires re: Spring Runoff so I am including some general information below. In addition, I would like to remind customers and businesses to continue preparing their emergency plans for homes and businesses as well as for non-emergency Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) events. (**There are no PSPS events anticipated at this time**). I have also included the same links to SCE resources which I sent to you last Fall if you are able to distribute. Sorry my schedule won't allow me to attend but please let me know if there are any utility-related questions that come out of the meeting.

Runoff:

- Though we are anticipating increased water flows into and out of our reservoirs during peak runoff (June- August), we do not believe these flows will pose significant dam safety risks.
- The safety of our employees, contractors, and communities is our number one priority. We continue to operate our hydro-electric system with restrictions on reservoir levels to meet safety and seismic requirements and inspect all SCE dams regularly per state and federal guidelines.
- With the work completed since 2017 (Rush Creek System), we do not currently
 anticipate the need for major construction work. The improvements allow us to
 more effectively manage the release of excess water and reduce potential
 downstream impacts.
- Though our team develops and consults forecasting models, weather is always unpredictable and there are several variables which remain unknown. SCE will continue to monitor weather conditions to further inform our preparations.
- We are reducing water levels in our reservoirs to effectively manage capacity and the flow of projected natural snowmelt runoff. We do this by draining excess water through the powerhouse, large pipes, and relief valves.
- SCE is working with local agencies to provide timely updates regarding our planning and the timing of any needed water releases.
- We are also working with federal and state agencies to ensure mitigation strategies are comprehensive to help prepare customers located in downstream communities and have reviewed and amended our Emergency Action Plan (EAP) in consultation with governmental partners and key-stakeholders.

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Emergency Preparedness and Customer Care Resources:

Medical Baseline Allowance Program (Overview):

If you or someone in your household requires the regular use of electrically-operated medical equipment or other qualifying medical devices, our Medical Baseline Allowance program can provide an extra 16.5 kilowatt hours of electricity per day. Provided at the lowest baseline rate, this helps offset the cost of operating the medical equipment.

Regardless of your household income, you may qualify if you meet the eligibility requirements below. We encourage you to apply for the Medical Baseline Allowance. You may be eligible for the Medical Baseline Allowance if you or another full-time resident in your home:

- 1. Requires the regular use of electrically-operated medical/life support equipment to sustain, replace, or restore a vital physical function, and/or
- 2. Is affected by a condition including multiple sclerosis, scleroderma, or is paraplegic, quadriplegic, or hemiplegic (see list on **sce.com/medicalbaseline**), or
- 3. Has a life-threatening illness or compromised immune system that requires heating and/or cooling.

Portable Power Generator Rebates Program (Overview):

Beginning September 1, 2022, you may be eligible to receive a \$200 rebate (or a \$600 rebate for income-qualified or medical baseline customers) for the purchase of a qualifying Portable Power Generator. You must be located in an area designated as a Tier 2 or Tier 3 high fire risk area. Start shopping today for a generator or apply for your rebate on SCE Marketplace. If you Already purchased a qualifying generator and would like to claim your rebate visit the SCE Marketplace and click the Product Rebate (Quick Link) to apply for your rebate.
